On behalf of the board, staff, and members of the Solvang Chamber of Commerce, I am pleased to share with you the attached annual report highlighting the success of our Chamber of Commerce's economic development and tourism programs. We are committed to furthering the economic development of our community through support of existing businesses, attraction of new businesses and business start-ups, and the promotion of our community as a tourism/hospitality destination.

The Solvang Chamber of Commerce is the first and only SBA Small Business Development Center to ever be established in northern Santa Barbara County. Throughout 2021 and the year to date in 2022 the Chamber has assisted more than 310 businesses in obtaining federal, state and county grants and loans, totaling more than \$1.75 million. We have also provided technical support and a broad range of business advisory services to more than 275 businesses.

The Solvang Chamber of Commerce has partnered with our local schools and other nonprofit organizations in their STEM and STEAM programs. We have also partnered with the Santa Barbara County Green Business Program to support environmentally friendly business practices.

Economic development and tourism require sustained effort and highly visible wins. Our board believes that the community is best served by ongoing efforts to ensure our community continues to fully support business enterprises and activities. The work we have done to build federal, state and county alliances, together with the new leadership at both the city and the Chamber will help us leverage the excitement and interest being generated in the city as current and new projects are built out.

The investments made in promoting local tourism by our hotel partners, Visit SVY, Tourism Advisory Committee (TAC) and the City of Solvang are beginning to show significant results. We are confident that the coming year will further the effectiveness of the marketing campaign that has been created and launched.

Economic Development Business Support Center

Since 2019, the Solvang Chamber of Commerce has been a partner of the Economic Development Collaborative (EDC), the Small Business Administration (SBA) and the Service Core of Retired Executives (SCORE). These strategic partnerships allow us to assist new and established local businesses.



The EDC is the umbrella organization through which we provide Small Business Development Center (SBDC) business advisory services free of charge to local businesses.



The SBA was created to support small businesses. The SBA provides free business counseling through its network of SBDC offices, SBA guaranteed business loans, home, and business disaster loans (including the EIDL loan program), administered the PPP loan programs. and provides assistance in obtaining federal government contracts.



SCORE has been mentoring new and existing businesses for over 40 years and has a network of over 13,000 volunteers who donate their time to help entrepreneurs. Santa Barbara SCORE volunteers are retired or semi-retired executives providing a unique spectrum of industry experience and management expertise. SCORE offers free mentoring, workshops and interactive training.


The Chamber of Commerce provides additional resources and support to our local business community in fulfilling its mission as a Chamber of Commerce and SBDC.







Solvang Chamber 2022-Today Finacial Impact



FUNDING THE MISSION

Economic development is long-term work. The Chamber works with the Econ Alliance and Reach in support of the efforts by Santa Barbara County and the cities within the county to expand broadband capacity within the community. The funding strategy has focused on multi-year partnerships grants and contracts to implement through 2025.

The Solvang Chamber of Commerce plans to continue to build and expand the organization over the next five years. If each of our investors continues their current level of support we are on track to exceed our 5-year goal, positioning the Chamber to deliver on the mission of supporting business for economic growth.

The Solvang Chamber board determines the general direction of Chamber operations and provides oversight for the business and financial operations of the chamber staff. The Chamber board, SBDC/EDC advisors, and staff identify key barriers to economic growth and develop action plans designed to address specific issues that can be implemented.

The City of Solvang and the Solvang Chamber of Commerce are deeply committed to the local community's economic growth serving the City of Solvang, and the surrounding areas of the Santa Ynez Valley to maintain a cohesive collaborative partnership in an advisory role regarding a broad range of issues for all business and residence

The Chamber, together with the city, engaged in a Business Retention and Economic Development study which included whether Copenhagen Drive should be closed. That study sought input from local residents, the business community and city government officials. Another issue that was addressed was whether and how the city could begin to grow through annexation of adjacent land, such as the agricultural land along the western city limits of Solvang.

During the current fiscal year, the Chamber staff received updates on and provided input about the local industrial/commercial real estate inventory and workforce training initiatives at the high school district.







Santa Barbara County Broadband Strategy Development

Solvang Chamber has been a partner with Santa Barbara County Broadband Strategic Development Project for the last 7 years.

Prepared in partnership by the Broadband Alliance of Santa Barbara County. The partnership was formed in 2022 between the Santa Barbara County Association of Governments (SBCAG), County of Santa Barbara, and the cities of Buellton, Carpinteria, Goleta, Guadalupe, Lompoc, Santa Barbara, Santa Maria, and Solvang, the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians, Broadband Consortium of the Pacific Coast (BCPC), and regional economic development organizations. The Regional Broadband Strategic Plan aims to identify broadband internet infrastructure and affordability needs in Santa Barbara County. The Alliance intends to leverage the plan to seek funding opportunities for projects to improve countywide affordable access to high-speed broadband in homes, schools, businesses, healthcare, and to connect community anchor institutions.







Investment

To amplify local investment for the future of businesses in Solvang, we have been ramping up efforts to bring state and federal money to the community.

Competitive grant opportunities have come online at both levels in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, on top of existing programs the region has never previously tapped. Bringing home just one or two of these grants will have a significant impact to the community.

Through dedicated programs such as the Restaurant Resilience Grants, PG&E helped keep cafes and dining establishments opened during the recent downturns," Executive Director of the Solvang Chamber of Commerce Tracy Beard said, who helped to promote the program to the Chamber's members resulting in a total of \$18,000 to six restaurants in the Solvang area. "The Solvang Chamber was proud to partner with PG&E in identifying local restaurants capable of meeting the criteria for the grants. We are pleased to have been helpful in securing these grants for our community."

The Foundation's additional contribution to CRF's Restaurants Care Resilience Fund will help restaurants pay for equipment upgrades to alleviate deferred maintenance, and for employee retention to help with industry-wide staffing shortages, both of which have been on the backburner for the last two years due to increased debt, losses, and costs. The recent funding follows a \$500,000 contribution earlier this year.

California Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant

The Solvang Chamber of Commerce assisted local business to apply for the grant.

The CA Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant Program provides grants from \$5,000 to \$25,000 to eligible small businesses and nonprofits impacted by COVID-19 and the related health and safety restrictions. Lendistry has been designated by the state to act as the intermediary for the Program.



FEMA Disaster Assistance

U.S. Small Business Administration Office of Disaster Recovery and Resilience offers assistance for businesses, homeowners, and renters affected by the Severe Winter Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides that occurred on Dec. 27, 2022, through January 31, 2023.

Through the EDC (Economic Development Collaborative) the Solvang Chamber of Commerce was able to assist businesses in the central coast that were affected during the storm.














Influence + Impact

- 1. **Programs & Services:** The Solvang Chamber will continue to update, communicate and manage its set of performance metrics in response to ever changing markets and business opportunities.
- 2. **Staffing & Operations:** The Solvang Chamber will regularly monitor our programs and processes to assure that we have the necessary operational and administrative support.
- 3. **Board Development:** The Chamber is committed to maintaining a diverse board of directors that properly reflects the businesses and qualifications that make up our community.
- 4. **Funding:** The Solvang Chamber will continue to pursue funding to strengthen our ability to provide serviced to clients free of charge. As an example, our partnership with Union Bank has facilitated providing increased support to clients.
- 5. Marketing & Outreach: The Chamber will further its marketing efforts in Solvang, the Santa Ynez Valley and throughout Northern Santa Barbara County, to develop and strengthen long term relationships throughout the region.
